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


#### **Barriers**

- access to equipment




# Reasons for not using the Internet

#### Wider benefits

- prolongs active citizenship
- inhibits onset of Alzheimer's and Parkinson's
- learners 13% more likely to give up smoking
- learners 34% increase in racial tolerance
- learners much less likely to be politically cynical
- learners less dissatisfied with their lives
